

It is one of the universal practices of Orthodox Christianity that the homily offered at the Pascha Liturgy is not offered out of the individual person of the priest, but out of the collective heart and voice of the Church from throughout the ages. It is best embodied in the Paschal Homily of St. John

Chrysostom from the fourth century. As we continue the bright and beautiful celebration, please allow me to simply

If anyone has wearied himself in fasting, let him now receive his recompense. If anyone has labored from the first hour, let him today receive his just reward. If anyone has come at the third hour, with thanksgiving let him keep the feast. If anyone has arrived at the sixth hour, let him have no misgivings; for he shall suffer no loss. If anyone has delayed until the ninth hour, let him draw near without hesitation. If anyone has arrived even at the eleventh hour, let him not fear on account of his delay. For the Master is gracious and receives the last, even as the first; he gives rest to him that comes at the eleventh hour, just as to him who has labored from the first. He has mercy upon the last and cares for the first; to the one he gives, and to the other he is gracious. He both honors the work and praises the intention.

offer it to you here once again, not in the depths of the night of the Resurrection

Enter all of you, therefore, into the joy of our Lord, and, whether first or last, receive your reward. O rich and poor, one with another, dance for joy! O you ascetics and you negligent, celebrate the day! You that have fasted and you that have disregarded the fast, rejoice today! The table is rich-laden; feast royally, all of you! The calf is fatted; let no one go forth hungry!

Let all partake of the feast of faith. Let all receive the riches of goodness. Let no one lament his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one mourn his transgressions, for pardon has dawned from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the Saviour's death has set us free.

He that was taken by death has annihilated it! He descended into hades and took hades captive! He embittered it when it tasted his flesh! And anticipating this Isaiah exclaimed, "Hades was embittered when it encountered thee in the lower regions." It was embittered, for it was abolished! It was embittered, for it was mocked! Riches In Christ Jesus The Joy Of Our Salvation And The Hope

Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen!

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who according to His great mercy has begotten us again unto a living hope by the Resurrec-

tion of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3).

Everything we need for living a happy, useful, and triumphant life we find in Christ Jesus. He added enjoyment to a happy occasion in Cana of Galilee by the miracle He performed at a marriage feast. When Jesus dined with Zacchaeus, understanding developed to such an extent that the tax gatherer was saved from a life of

selfishness and greed.

It was in the home of a Pharisee that Jesus reclaimed a sinner, and all the guests became conscious of His power. It was in the breaking of bread that the *Risen Lord* was able to restore in fearful disciples the spirit of triumph.

No person and no home is ever the same after the Son of God has entered. His

presence proves to be a saving power from all manner of mistakes and sins. More than that, the riches of Jesus Christ become our possessions ever increasing and more precious with each passing day.

The Second Sunday In May: Mother's Day

One of the sweetest memories that anyone can have is the memory of a good mother. When everything else fails, for the little bug, Hermie turns to his Heavenly Father and prays about this problem. He tells God that Stanley is really stinky and asks if He can fix this problem. Well do you know what? Hermie felt God answer the prayer: Maybe Stanley is not the problem. Just stan and

answer the prayer: Maybe Stanley is not the problem. Just stop and think: why does he smell? God gives bad smells to some animals to protect themselves when they are afraid ... so maybe Stanley is just afraid! 







Άν Μιλούσαν Τά Δάκρυα

Καί ποιός μάς είπε ότι τά δάκρυα δέν μιλούν. Μιλούν στήν παγκόσμια γλώσσα τής καρδιάς γιά νά μπορούν νά τήν διαβάζουν οί άνθρωποι όλης τής γής καί όποιας ήλικίας.

Αν ἐπιχειρούσαμε νὰ μεταφράσωμε τήν γλώσσαν τών δακρύων, θὰ ἐπλημμύριζαν τήν ζωή μας όλα τὰ είδη τών τραγουδιών, ἀπό τούς

άλαλαγμούς τής χαράς μέχρι τών σπαραγμούς, άπό τούς παιάνες τών ένθουσιασμών μέχρι τό μοιρολοϊ τού άνέκφραστου πόνου.

Θά ξεγλιστρούσαν αύθόρμητα οι ψιθυρισμοί ἀπό τίς μυστικές τής καρδιάς μας συγκινήσεις, πού κανείς δέν θέλομε νά τίς ξέρη, τάχα ποιός μπορεί νά έρμηνεύση έσωτερικά βιώματα πού οϋτε έμείς οι ϊδιοι κάποτε δέν τολμούμε νά ἀποκρυπτογραφήσωμε.

Αν όσα λένε τά δακρυσμένα μάτια μας έγράφοντο μέ γράμματα ή μέ νότες στό πεντάγραμμο, δέν θ'άντεχε οϋτε ή ματιά, οϋτε ή άκοή μας τούς θρήνους, τά παράπονα, τά έρωτηματικά, τίς τύψεις, τήν ντροπή, γιά τά άνομολόγητα λάθη μας πού οϋτε μονάχοι μας κάποτε δέν θέλομε νά παραδεχθούμε.

Καί όμως! Ό, τι δέν λένε τά χείλη καί δέν γράφει το χέρι, τό δημοσιοποιεί πολλές φορές τών ματιών μας τό δάκρυ. Καί τό δάκρυ μιλάει είλικρινά, δέν γνωρίζει τήν γλώσσα τής ὑποκρισίας, τής άδυναμίας, τών ψεὐτικων συναισθηματισμών. Ξαφνικά ἀναποδογυρίζει τό ποτήρι τών διαλογισμών πού μαζεύει στής ψυχής μας τά φυλλοκάρδια τά σύννεφα, πού

πυκνώνει μέσα μας κάθε εϊδους εύαισθησία, καί άνεβάζει στά μάτια τήν βροχήν τών δακρύων. Άρκεί νά διασχίση τόν ούρανόν τής ψυχής μας ή άστραπή μιάς άλήθειας, ίκανής νά τήν συγκινήση. Χαρά στόν άνθρωπο πού έχει τότε τήν εύαισθησία νά κλάψη.

Κλασσικό τό παράδειγμα μέσα στό Εύαγγέλιον

Τό ἀμάρτημα σχεδόν μέ τήν ϊδια βαρύτητα τού Ἰούδα καὶ τού κορυφαίου Ἀποστόλου Πέτρου, ὁ πρώτος Τόν ἐπρόδωσε, Τόν ἐπούλησεν, ὁ προδότης! Ὁ ἀλλος Τόν ἀρνήθη, ἐβεβαίωνε πώς δέν Τόν ξέρει καὶ μάλιστα μεθ'όρκου' στήν πιό κρίσιμη ώρα τής ζωής Του, όταν ὁ Κύριος, μόνος, ἐγκαταλελειμμένος, ἐξευτελισμένος, δαρμένος, ἐδικάζετο γιὰ νὰ θανατωθή!

Ομως! Όμως ή ἀστραπή τής ἀγάπης τοὺ Κυρίου ἐβγήκε γεμάτη στοργή καὶ τρυφερότητα ἀπό τήν Θεϊκή ματιά Του...καὶ πέρασε στήν ματιά τοὺ Ἀποστόλου Του κι ἐφτασε στά βάθη τής καρδιάς τοὺ, κι ὁ Μαθητής, ὁ γενναϊος στήν Πίστι καὶ στήν αὐταπάρνησι, συγκλονίσθηκε `καὶ ἑξελθών ἑξω ἐκλαυσε πικρώς' (Μάρκ. κστ'75).

Στήν κατάπικρη ώρα τού πειρασμού ὁ Ἀπόστολος Πέτρος δέν ἀρνήθηκε τόν καλόν ἐαυτόν τού, θυμήθηκε κάτω ἀπό τό θεϊκό χάδι ἐκείνης τής ματιάς τού Διδασκάλου τού, ό, τι τού εϊχε πεί πρίν ἀπό λίγο, ότι πρίν νά λαλήση ὁ πετεινός, θά μὲ ἀρνηθής τρεϊς φορές!... Καί καθώς τό λάλημα τού κόκκορα σὰν ξερή σκουξιά ἐσκισε τό σκοτάδι τής τραγικώτερης νύχτας τού κόσμου, ή βροχή

τών δακρύων τού γενναίου Μαθητού έπότισε τήν ψυχή πού άμάρτησε, καί όχι μόνον τήν δική τού, έπεσε μαλακή, ποτιστική, σωτήρια στό σκληρό χώμα τής άμαρτίας τής κάθε μιάς άνθρώπινης ψυχής, κι άφησε νά άντηχή στούς αίώνες τό τραγούδι τής μετανοίας, λυτρωτικό, άναστάσιμο, χαροποιό.

Τό μήνυμα διαχρονικό. Δέν ὑπάρχει ἀμάρτημα, όσο βαρύ καὶ ἀν εϊναι, πού νά μπορή νὰ νικήση τήν ἀγάπη τού Χριστού. Ἡ ψυχή πού ἀμάρτησε, έχει δρόμο νὰ γυρίση στή συγγνώμη. Ἁρκεϊ νὰ μή πνίξη μέσα της τήν εὐαισθησία τής ἀποδοχής τού μηνύματος πού τής στέλνει ή Θεία στοργή. Τό ξέρω πώς ἀμάρτησα, λέει καὶ κλαὶει ὁ Ὠπόστολος Πέτρος, ἀλλὰ ξαναγυρίζω συντριμμένος σὲ Σένα, τὸν Υίὸν τού Θεού καὶ Σωτήρα μου. Καὶ περιμένω ἀπό Σένα τήν λύτρωσι.

Κάποτε Σού έδινα ύποσχέσεις, ότι ποτέ δέν θά Σέ έγκαταλείψω, κι άς κάμουν ό, τι θέλουν οἱ άλλοι...γιατί έγώ εϊμαι σταθερός κι ἡρωϊσμό πού τόν ἀπέδειξα...τόσες φορές...Τώρα ἡ ἀμαρτία μέ ἐκαμε κουρέλι, λυπήσου με...

Δέν φαίνεται πουθενά μέσα στήν ίστορία τών άνθρώπων νά έκλαψεν άμαρτωλός γιά τήν πτώσι του καί νά μή συγχωρέθηκε άπό τήν εύσπλαχνία τού Θεού.

Ό Ἰούδας δέν έκλαψε συντριμμένος, διότι δέν μετενόησεν, ἀπλώς 'μετεμελήθη'. Καί τόν κατάπιεν ἡ ἀπόγνωσις, αὐτοκτόνησε, καί τόν έκέρδησεν ὁ ἀδης.

Part of a special series of educational features designed to provide "continuing education" to our parishioners. Taken from the publication, "Our Worship," which examines and explains the main elements of worship in the Orthodox Christian Church.

Living the Sacramental Life

Jesus described the Kingdom of God as a seed.

- · How is it implanted and nurtured in us?
- · How does the seed grow, so that everything in our lives becomes a "means of grace"?
- · How does the seed mature so that we see the whole world as a "sacrament" of God?
- · How does the seed grow and make us partakers of the Kingdom of God?

The answer is ...

by our regular and faithful participation in the Sacramental Life of the Church!

Through the "leaven" of the Holy Mysteries:

- · our lives are filled with the Life of God
- · the world is transformed into God's Kingdom
- · reality is transfigured to reflect the radiance of the Glory of God

The Mysteries of Initiation, or Holy Illumination

At the end of the baptismal service, the priest washes the oil and Chrism from the baptized saying, "You are

baptized, You are illuminated, You have been chrismated. You are sanctified. You are washed in the Name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

These word sum up the amazing action of God in baptism.

Holy Illumination consists of:

- · Exorcism (turning away from the devil, we unite ourselves to Christ and the faith of the Church)
- · Anointing (we are restored, renewed, and recreated in soul and body by the "oil of gladness")
- Immersion (in the baptismal water, we are "buried" with Christ in the water and raised to New Life)
- Clothing (we are now clothed a white robe, having "put on" the righteousness of Christ)
- Chrismation (in this "sealing" with Holy Chrism is our "personal Pentecost," the gift of the Holy Spirit)
- Procession (carrying candles and led by the priest, we begin our lifelong walk with the Lord while the faithful sing, "As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ...")
- · Holy Communion (our bond with Christ and His Body, the Church, is fully realized as we share in the communion in the Body and Blood of Christ)
- Ablution or washing (as the Holy Chrism is washed off, we pray for God to preserve us in the faith and life of
- · Tonsuring (strands of our hair are cut as a sign of the offering of all of ourselves to God)

Practical Stages of Growth in the "Sacramental Life"

- 1. Our "Everyday Time" is interrupted now and then by "Church Times"
 - · We go to Church on Sundays and feast days whenever we can.
- 2. We become more involved in worship and prayer
 - · We start attending services regularly
 - · We attend Vigil on Saturday evenings
 - We celebrate the feasts.
 - We begin a daily discipline of prayer
- 3. We live by two calendars: our "Everyday Calendar" and our "Church Calendar."
 - At first, one of the calendars will dominate.
 - · Gradually we begin to put the two calendars together through
 - daily prayer
 - regular attendance
 - seeking to do the will of God at all times.
- 4. Our calendars are integrated as one.
 - · We become aware of how the "Church Time" penetrates the "Everyday Time"
 - · Our "Church Time" informs and brings hope of the Kingdom to our "Everyday Time"
