My Beloved Spiritual Children in Christ,

If you listen to the press, this is no way to start a New Year: "Anxiety about terrorism, crime and divisions ... are contributing to a growing pessimism among Americans, according to a sweeping new survey of national values released Tuesday. The latest sampling of American values on a wide range of issues found an 11 percentage point spike in the number of Americans who believe the country's "best days are behind us" — 49 percent said they thought America's best days were in the past." (Washington Times, November 17, 2015).

The best days are behind us? Really? If we allow our hopes and our future to be dashed on the rocks of social trends, economic predictions and political and cultural tides, it is easy to see how we could be led to believe that. Before we get on board the downhill wagon, we should ask, "Is that really who we are as a community, as a nation and as the Church?"

Instead, as we head into this New Year of the Lord, I encourage us to put the polls away and draw on three things that have brought this community and its people from a noble past to where it is today, and which will carry them through this year and into the future: 1) Greek spirit; 2) American courage; 3) Christian hope.

**Greek spirit:** When I was a child, an uncle proudly showed me an album he had made of news clippings from World War II, chronicling all the victories credited to the Greek spirit of courage and refusal to surrender. This spirit is well documented at a new website, [oxidayfoundation.org](http://oxidayfoundation.org), where Winston Churchill is quoted saying, "If there had not been the virtue and courage of the Greeks, we do not know which the outcome of World War II would have been." Greeks have faced centuries of political challenges and religious persecutions, including nearly 400 years of Ottoman enslavement and oppression. We know how to endure. For Greeks, there is always a better future ahead. Let us not abandon that spirit this year.

**American courage:** President Harry Truman said, "America was not built on fear. America was built on courage, on imagination and an unbeatable determination to do the job at hand." This year, forget the polls and focus on the "job at hand" of proclaiming the Good News and preserving the freedom (Luke 4.18) that has made America great and will keep it shining brightly as the "city on the hill" for generations to come.

**Christian hope:** The above two ideas are indeed essential to walking with freedom and courage in this world, but lest we get caught up and weighed down in the thought that it is all about this life alone, at the end of the day we must embrace the ultimate hope of the Psalm that proclaims, "And now, O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in you" (Psalm 39.7). Our final victory, reward and hope is not in this life. No matter our trials in this life, "thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15.17). The darkness of our own fallen condition does not diminish His Holy Light.

So this year, may we not surrender to fear or despondency. Our Greek and American forefathers hearken unto us, and the saints and martyrs of the past two thousand years have shown us the way through fear to victory in Christ. Let us learn from them, follow them and never forget.

#### Tue., Jan. 5: The Forefeast of Theophany

This is the main Orthros and Divine Liturgy of this great Feast. We will again offer the Great Blessings of the Water at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy. (HT)

This feast of the "greatest of the prophets" and Forerunner of Christ is held on the day after Theophany. (SG)

## JANUARY 2016 – "THE VOICE OF HOLY TRINITY CHURCH"

**B**eloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ: It's not enough to just say Happy New Year. We need to do more. We should REPENT, RESOLVE and REMEMBER. We know that REPENTANCE is the first step to God. We will never be saved until first of all we have repented our sins. A petition from the Divine Liturgy states: "For the completion of our lives in peace and repentance, let us ask the Lord." We then have to RESOLVE ourselves to become a

better person. "I will try to be a better Christian." And then we need to REMEMBER that we can never repay Christ for all that HE has done for us. What has He done? He knew that we had sinned and that the wrath of God would fall upon us. So He went to the cross and took our place and died in our stead. REMEMBER to say in the New Year, "I will do my best for Christ."

*The following verses from the Old and New Testament will help us to become better and more faithful Christians.*

### We Travel Life's Highway

**Thy word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. (Psalm 119:105)**

We are on our way traveling life's highway. We do not know what lies ahead. There is no road map that can chart our course. We travel the road each day into the unknown. We can be assured that the road will be variable. Parts of it will be paved, parts will be rough and dangerous, and other parts will bring the unexpected. There will be dangerous curves along the way. There will be forced detours. There will be dead-end streets. This is life. In a sense, we are explorers, discovering the unknown. But surely we would not have it otherwise, for with its mystery and danger comes adventure and interest. It is best that we do not know every mile of the way. Even though we are faced with mystery, we can be assured that there is guidance for our daily travel. We can look back and see the road others have traveled and learn from them, and from our own experience we know that there is a controlling and guiding hand along the way. So, as we travel life's highway, we can do so with faith – faith in God. We can be assured that he will guide us if we seek His help and let Him.

### To a New Life – To a New Year

**If any one is in Christ, he is a new creation. (II Cor. 5:17)**

When someone meets you – you who may be encrusted with fears, worry and bitterness, with envy and jealousy – and helps to set you free, he is a true Christian. When he helps you love yourself for what you really are, the only one of its kind that God has made, and helps set you free from all that would keep you from being yourself, he brings you the Good News!

When a person helps you to accept yourself – the real you – knowing that you are a wonderful creation, made to love and to be loved, to labor, to create, to achieve, to forgive, to trust -- then you can know that you have been the recipient of

the Gospel. When another helps you to discover that you are never alone, that God is the ground of your being, involved in all that you do and concerned in every affair of your life, then that person has been for you a Christian. When you find a power that can make you know that you are really a lovable creature, and can free you from all that makes you unloving, you have been visited by God.

### Remember Who We Are

**Therefore be imitators of God as beloved children. (Eph. 5:1)**

How do "beloved children" of God act? We are to forgive as God in Christ has forgiven us. We are to express God's universal love, for we are given our example of this love in Christ's love for us. The scope of our love must be wide. It is to extend beyond the family, beyond the store or club or class or nation or race, to include our enemies. And why must our love reach beyond all human barriers? We are all children of the one heavenly Father whose method of dealing with us is evidenced in Christ. So to be imitators of God means to share in the mighty drama of Christ's self-giving in the world. To be imitators of God means to die to the false claims of the self, to die daily to the claims of evil, and to share in Christ's resurrection: to live because Christ is risen in us, and his love and his purpose pervade our whole being. We are to "walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." We are enabled to walk in love because we respond to what God has done for us in Jesus Christ.

### Acting Like A Christian

**But be doers of the word, and not bearers only, deceiving yourselves. (James 1:22)**

In our scripture verse for today, James is saying, "Prove your faith by acting like a Christian." He is calling us back to a life of obedience, a discipleship that means and costs something. His theme is that Christian maturity must show itself in Christian doing. James makes one supreme test of the religious life, and that is our attitude toward others. In James 2:8 we read, "If you really fulfill the royal law, according to the scripture, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself', you do well". For him the Christian community is essentially a brotherhood, where all difference between poor and rich drop away. He is concerned that there be gentleness of speech within the brotherhood. He had experience with the "railing tongue" and had heard of churches disrupted by it. Be "quick to hear, slow to speak." The unkind tongue is the expression of an unkind temper, and an unkind temper is alien to the name of Christ and to the perfect law. "If anyone thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this man's religion is vain" (James 1:26).

Happy Name Day to all who celebrate in the month of January. As for myself, I was born 90 years ago on January 7th, which according to the old calendar is Christmas Day.




This is also a time for reflection, and taking stock. What's important in our lives? How did we do certain things the year that passed? Regrets perhaps, resolving to do better the next time around.

Whatever our resolutions might be, let us continue to improve

upon one thing, as part of our Christian lives: Gratitude. You are already on the right path. Stewardship is an expression of our gratitude to God for His faithfulness in our lives. The story of Louis Zamperini comes to mind when mentioning gratitude and forgiveness. He was an Olympian and WWII hero who survived for 47 days drifting in a rubber raft and was later tortured relentlessly in Japanese prisoner of war camps. After he was freed, he was asked what led him to dedicate his life to Christ. He recalled a Billy Graham rally, where he heard him say: "When people come to the end of their rope and there's nowhere else to turn, they turn to God." I thought, Zamperini said in an interview, that's what I did on the raft. All I did was pray to God, every day. In prison camp, the main prayer was, "Get me home alive, God, and I'll seek you and serve you." I came home, got wrapped up in the celebration, and forgot about the hundreds of promises I'd made to God. So, I asked God to forgive me for not being conscious that He answered my prayer requests. While I was still on my knees, I knew there was a change. It happened within seconds..So I got up, went home, and that was the first night in four years that I didn't have a nightmare.

Zamperini later visited Japan, where he met with his former captors, embraced and forgave them. He died in 2014, peacefully at home, at the age of 97. So, an added bonus: It is scientifically proven that gratitude is also good for our health! Your Holy Trinity stewardship family wishes you peace and health through gratitude to God. We too offer our thanks to you, for sharing your God-given gifts for the greater good.





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# The Feast of Theophany and the Blessing of Homes and Businesses

*“At Your Epiphany, the whole creation sang Your praises. For You, our God, have appeared on earth and dwelt among men. You have sanctified the streams of the Jordan, sending down from on high the most Holy Spirit.”*

*From the Service of the Great Blessing of the Waters*



## “What is Theophany?”

Every year on January 6th, the Orthodox Church celebrates the Feast of Holy Theophany, which is the baptism of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This is one of the Twelve Great Feasts of the Church and is also known by the name, “Epiphany.” The Baptism of Christ in the River Jordan at the hand of St. John the Baptist sets the example for our own baptism by water in the Holy Spirit.

## “How do we celebrate Theophany?”

The main celebration is, of course, found in the Church with the holy services on January 5th (the Forefeast), January 6th (Theophany) and January 7th (Synaxis of St. John the Baptist). We also take the feast home with us by having our homes blessed with the Holy Water.

## “What happens during a House Blessing?”

You will receive a call to confirm your appointment a day or two ahead. When the priest arrives, he will conduct a brief service either in your dining room or at the place where your family usually offers its prayers. It is best to have the entire family present if possible, especially children. Please be sure to have an icon and a list of the first names of all the members of your household. If you have a home censer, you may prepare it also. A bowl of water is not necessary, as the priest will bring the holy water sprinkler from the church.

The priest will offer the blessing service and offer the names of the people present and those contained on the family names list in prayer. As the service concludes, please lead the priest throughout the house to sprinkle the holy water while chanting the hymn of Theophany. He will bring a copy of the service so you can follow along and chant the hymn. When the service is over,

please understand if your priest needs to keep the visit brief in order to cover all the homes scheduled on that day.

## “Should I Have Our House and Business Blessed Every Year?”

**Yes!** In the Orthodox Christian tradition, homes should be blessed each year to bring the blessings of the Feast of Theophany into the home and to rededicate ourselves and our family to the Lord. It is an annual commitment, celebration, thanksgiving and family prayer. It is also a pious way of asking God’s blessings on our business and livelihood as good stewards of all His gifts.

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
