


#### All In!

## This Is Our Time

Answering God's Love with Our Own As We Give Back to the Giver




t all started with Love. We just became once again witnesses to the greatest act of unselfish love, through the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. God's endless love for the human race. Panagia's motherly love and sacrifice. Joseph's noble love. Then, throughout His teachings, Jesus continued to lead by example; He taught us to love one another and to be compassionate toward those in need. Then, before He ascended, through the Apostles, He made us disciples of all nations and commanded that we spread the Gospel to all creation.

Over the centuries that followed the Gospel of Jesus Christ indeed began to spread through all creation – from the Jews, to the Greeks, to new lands and faraway peoples. To be sure, it did not happen without tremendous sacrifices of love, persecutions and immeasurable hardships that crowned so many faithful Christian martyrs, but true followers of Jesus were always strenthened by the Holy Spirit as they proclaimed their belief in the true faith.

A recent documentary offered an account of 18th century settlers in the United States. A group of immigrants were given land in the rolling hills of Pennsylvania. Families began setting up tents and temporary shelters. Then, a group of leaders surveyed the area and found the perfect spot. On top of a hill above their future homes they'd build their church. So, every single member of the group, before they had their own place to live, began the back-breaking work of cutting and carrying logs and stone up the hill for their community's place of worship. "A man must surely build God's house first before building a house for himself", explained one of the elders.

One hundred years ago, another devout group of Pennsylvania pilgrims arrived at a similar conclusion. They didn't have the luxury of choosing a hilltop, but rather a small building on the Northside of Pittsburgh would have to do. It was a humble beginning, but one achieved with sweat and tears nonetheless. These pioneers of great faith would not let their meager means and grueling work days get in their way of realizing their dream of having a Greek Orthodox Church to anchor their community.

Every ounce of their energy, every waking moment was expended on making their new church of the Holy Trinity a reality. Looking back now, we marvel at their unyielding faith, perseverance and vision. We speak of love and true sacrificial stewardship nowadays, and oftentimes our minds struggle to comprehend its full meaning.

Instead, we only need to look back to our own history to find a clear example, not just in the founders of our church (who sometimes had to go door-to-door to collect the funds necessary just to pay for the weekly utilities so that they can hold the next Liturgy), but also the ones who followed through the generations and to this day—with their own sacrificial contributions.

When our church needed to move to its 302 North Ave location, the members (now the children of the original founders), began raising the \$217,000

necessary for the new building in 1958.

In 1961, the church was built and consecrated. Iin less than two years' time, these laborers, coal miners, steelworkers, restaurateurs, clerks, barbers and housewives of this community paid off what would be today \$2.2 million for their church to become a reality.

Hard times would still come, but somehow always overcome – there were times that payroll could not be met until the ladies were done with the "Wednesday Lunch" cash receipts, at which point the Treasurer would deliver the cash bag to the bank and then stop at the church office to sign payroll checks.

A similar scenario of extraordinary giving repeated itself with our new beautiful church and a bigger dream that began in 2011.

"They said it couldn't be done" is one of the phrases most used for things that are beyond business planning and logic. But not here at Holy Trinity Church. Our DNA has a "we will get it done whatever it takes" heredity. We are overachievers. We are visionaries. We are hopeful. We put our full faith in Christ.

If a family generation lasts about 25 years, we are now entering the 5th generation of Holy Trinity families and community. Generations 1-4 look to us and count on us. Today's generation of church leaders are being called—or will be called—to answer the challenge of keeping the dream of this holy church alive and growing.

If you are reading this and your first thought is "He's talking about someone else, not me," please think again. God has given us all gifts. Some are pronounced and others are hidden. When we are called to serve, to be good stewards of His creation and kingdom on earth, all we are doing is using our God-given gifts for their intended purpose - to give back to the Giver. We are especially blessed with so many gifted young people, many of whom are leaders in their fieldcreative, energetic, thoughtful. Christ's call to each of us can be loud and clear, like that to the Apostles, or subtle. It can be that inside voice that you may be hearing occasionally – maybe right now – whispering in your head "I've got to do more; I know I can help here; I have some ideas; this church is mine, what have I done for it?"

Please don't ignore that voice. It is the call to answer God's love with our own, straight from the heart. This year we are not just celebrating the past 100 years. We are entering the Second Holy Trinity Centennial! How it will take shape, what will be achieved and how it will be remembered depend on our actions, and especially the leadership of many who God has blessed with the gifts and talents to be the leaders of the next generation.

A verse in Greek poem translates like this: "Under the ground, in their crossed hands, our ancestors are holding, the rope of the church bell – they wait for the time, to ring in the good news."

Let's make sure the bell rings with every generation. This is our time to make it happen.





## Gheronda, I believe, but sometimes I have a fear within.

The fear you have is a blessing from God; it is the economy of God causing you to take refuge in Him through prayer. It will help you to take hold of God. Take a small child for example: if his parents do not instill the fear of harm in him, then they will not be able to restrain him. Struggle with both love and hope in God and then you will not fear anything. Keep in mind what we chant in the Great Apodeipno: "For we fear not your terror, neither are we troubled: For God is with us!"

#### Geronda, what is the correlation between a peaceful conscience and the fear of God?

Why, if one does not have fear of God, what conscience can he possibly have? Without the fear of God, one can easily trample his conscience, and then he ceases to be human.


#### Geronda, when I feel gratitude for a person, I can do whatever he asks. But I am troubled because the same does not also happen with God. Am I not thankful enough to Him?

You may have gratitude for God within you, but there is no excitement, no spiritual flight. You feel more gratitude towards a person because you are more aware of his presence, You need to do spiritual work, so that you can feel the presence of God more intensely. If you increase Your awareness of the presence of God, then you will also increase your gratitude toward God. Now you say "Our Father..." and you do not feel anything. But if you felt that God is indeed your Father, you wouldn't be able to bear saying those words!

One must be constantly aware of the presence of God. When one is aware of the presence of God, of the Angels and of the saints, it acts as a strong brake that keeps him from going astray. David says, "I have set the Lord always before me: because He is at my right hand, I shall not be moved." If we conduct ourselves with the thought that God sees us, that He watches over us, whatever we do will be assured.

#### Geronda, I still confront everything in a human manner and not spiritually, and I am in agitation.

You place your programs ahead of the programs of God, and this is why you are tormented. Every problem can be solved with trust in God and humility. Do as much as you can do and then leave yourself to divine Providence, to the divine will. Hope in God

is accentuated faith; it is the greatest safeguard for a person.

Is it a small thing to have God as an ally? I remember, before joining the army, I had prayed to Saint Barbara to help me — I was devoted to her because as a boy, I would go to her country chapel and pray. Therefore, I prayed, "Let me endure dangers during the war, but do not let me kill anyone." And how the Good Lord arranged things! When the results of the assignments came out, other men who were educated were sent to the front line bearing arms, while I, with a grade-school education, was assigned to be a wireless operator!

The others teased me, "You must have some really good connections!" "What connections could I possible have? I don't know anybody." "Come on, don't try to fool us. You must know someone in the General Headquarters," they insisted. As they kept insisting, I relented and said, "Well, I do have Christ at the General Headquarters." And that is how it happened that I never had to use a rifle. •
